# Welcome to the November / December 2016 Edition

#### **RECENT BIRD REPORTS** - Headlines

**RING-NECKED DUCK\*** Nov & Dec: Paxton Pits a female from the 27<sup>th</sup> Nov to the end of December. **GREAT NORTHERN DIVER\*** Nov: Grafham Water from the 20<sup>th</sup> then 2 from the 29<sup>th</sup>. **Dec:** Grafham Water 2 early on, a single until the 23<sup>rd</sup>, then 3 on the 27<sup>th</sup> until the end of the month, all immatures.

The extraordinary recent run of records of this species continues, in contrast to records of Redthroated Diver (numbers in brackets below) which have become more scarce in recent decades. 1950s: 1(9), 1960s: 5(16), 1970s: 10 (24), 1980s: 14 (30), 1990s: 15 (10), 00s: 19 (8), 2010-16: 13 (6). GANNET Nov: Croydon one over on the 1<sup>st</sup>, Fen Drayton village one over on the 7<sup>th</sup>.

**CATTLE EGRET\*** Nov: Nene Washes on the  $2^{nd}$  until at least the  $17^{th}$ , then presumably the same on the  $27^{th} - 28^{th}$ . Dec: the Nene Washes bird from November was present throughout the month, Histon one flew over on the  $4^{th}$ , and Ouse Washes on the  $9^{th}$ .

**GLOSSY IBIS\*** Nov: Ely on the  $15^{th} - 30^{th}$ . Dec: Ely the same bird was present until at least the  $4^{th}$ , then presumably the same at Barway on the  $10^{th}$ .

**YELLOW-BROWED WARBLER\*** Nov: Cambridge on the 1<sup>st</sup>, Eaton Ford on the 24<sup>th</sup>.

**DIPPER\*** Nov & Dec: Barrington one present for both months (and indeed since July). This is the third county record; the December e-bulletin discussed the age and origin of this bird.

**SNOW BUNTING\*** Nov: Ickleton Grange on 14<sup>th</sup>.

**LAPLAND BUNTING\*** Nov: Eldernell 2 on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Dec: Ouse Washes one on the 3<sup>rd</sup>.

<u>Weather</u> Following the dry and fairly mild October, colder conditions arrived in the first week of November with frosts and temperatures in single figures, and the first serious rain for a couple of months. Towards the end of the month an area of high pressure delivered settled cloudy and cool conditions. December started with frost and clear cold days, but a milder Atlantic system soon moved in and persisted for much of the month with occasional colder days. After Christmas, storm Barbara moved across the country (although Cambridgeshire escaped the worst conditions) and this was followed by a cold spell with some sharp frosts and water bodies icing over once again.

#### A note on these records

Records in this bulletin are unchecked and may be revised at a later date. Asterisks indicate species for which it is necessary to send a description to the County Recorder for records to be accepted. The term 'reported from' gives an indication of distribution. Some species give maxima when a number of counts have been received. Where no numbers are given the record relates to a single bird. Occasionally the abbreviations M and F and 'max' are used.

Marsh Harrier Nov: Ouse Washes 10 on 14<sup>th</sup>, Wicken Fen 4 M on 5<sup>th</sup> and 2 F on 11<sup>th</sup>, Fen Drayton Lakes a juvenile on 7<sup>th</sup> and 2 on 19<sup>th</sup>, Nene Washes Eldernell 3 on 11<sup>th</sup>, Fowlmere NR on several dates, Tower Farm on 13<sup>th</sup>, Littleport May Farm 6 on 27<sup>th</sup> including a F on 28<sup>th</sup> with green wing tags reading P4. This is a truly peripatetic individual which hatched at Haddiscoe, Great Yarmouth in 2015 (the only female from clutch of 3), and has since been seen near Cardiff, then Otmoor RSPB near Oxford, Clacton, the Isle of Sheppey, and most recently Cley in April this year. **Buzzard Nov:** widely reported including Cam Washes (Waterbeach), Ouse Washes (15), Nene Washes (11), Fowlmere NR (2), Littleport May Farm (6), Sawston (by-pass) and Wicken Fen (3). **Dec:** at the above sites plus Fordham, Haddenham/Aldreth Fens (3), Paxton Pits (3), and Sutton North Fen on 17<sup>th</sup> and Swaffham Prior Fen on 30<sup>th</sup> (both pale birds but not to be confused with Roughlegged Buzzard).

**Osprey Nov:** Farcet Fen on 3<sup>rd</sup>. **Dec:** Grafham Water one reported by fishermen on the 5<sup>th</sup> – *the latest date ever in Cambridgeshire if confirmed.* 

#### Rails and crane

**Water Rail** Nov: reported from Chippenham Fen, Fowlmere NR, Littleport May Farm (6) and Wicken Fen (6). **Dec:** also at Nene Washes Eldernell, Fen Drayton Lakes, Grafham Water (5), Paxton Pits, Woodwalton Fen (c12), Cambridge (Logan's Meadow), and Little Wilbraham Fen (3).

**Coot** Wicken Fen 115 on the 11<sup>th</sup>, Grafham Water 1144 on 13<sup>th</sup>, Colne Fen GP 266 on 19<sup>th</sup>. **Dec:** Grafham Water c590 on 4<sup>th</sup>, Ouse Washes 298 on 19<sup>th</sup>.

**Common Crane** Nov: a group of 20-23 in the Ouse Washes area from late October, Nene Washes Guyhirn 3-4 on the  $6^{th}$  and  $13^{th}$ , Eldernell 3+ on  $10^{th}$ , 7 on  $19^{th}$  and  $25^{th}$  and 16 on  $27^{th}$ , Wicken Fen 5 on  $13^{th}$  (2 adults and 3 juveniles), Nene Washes March Farmers 9 in flight on  $26^{th}$ . **Dec:** Nene Washes resident 7 (two families) with various numbers (max 33) coming in to roost all month, Wicken Fen 9 flying over on  $11^{th}$ , Thorney Toll 4 flying over on  $12^{th}$ .

It seems that there is a resident group on the Nene Washes with other birds feeding in maize stubble and roosting on the Ouse Washes until it became too wet, since when they have moved to the Nene Washes. Records show that there is a minimum total of 33 Cranes (a new peak count for the County) in the fenland area. PB

#### Sand Martin Survey 2017

The latest Cambridgeshire Bird Atlas notes that a survey of Sand Martins (*Riparia riparia*) is overdue. I have recently been co-opted as the club's research officer and would like to instigate such a study in 2017.

Sand Martins are the smallest of the hirundines to be seen in Cambridgeshire. The flight is often described as "weak" or "fluttering" but even so they migrate thousands of miles and are one of our first summer visitors. The earliest county record comes from the Nene Washes, the 27<sup>th</sup> February 1994, and the latest is from the Ouse Washes, the 17<sup>th</sup> November 1968.

Sand Martins nest throughout most of Europe. They can cope with a wide range of climatic conditions, from the north of Norway to the hotter parts of Spain. They winter in Africa with British birds travelling through France and Spain to the Sahel.

The 2015 Cambridgeshire Bird Report notes that Sand Martins are on the "green list" but that they have suffered declines in the past. 184 pairs nested in 2015 at 7 sites. Peak counts recorded 175 individuals on the Cam Washes in spring and 500 at Burwell in late summer. The highest ever count was an estimated 2 million birds at a roost on the Ouse Washes in August 1968.

Birdlife (Birds in Europe 2004) give the status of the species as "depleted" with moderate declines in the late 20<sup>th</sup> century. They say the situation has stabilised but with very confused local variations. There appear, for instance, to have been recent gains in Ireland but falls in the UK.

A survey in Cambridgeshire should throw some light on the picture locally. It may also help us influence planning decisions and assess the value of purpose built nesting structures. The surveyors will be club members making specific notes of their observations during their normal bird watching. I do not envisage surveyors having to "sign up" for specific routes at specific intervals. I'm sure there are sufficient of us to produce interesting and valid results as part of our normal activities.

The study will be in two parts. Firstly, I would like to get an accurate and comprehensive record of nesting colonies. Secondly, I believe it would be valuable if we could get a more general idea of where the birds are and what they are doing. Sand Martins are insectivores but arrive early and leave late so certain habitats must be vital to their well-being.

I will prepare user friendly forms to assist us in the survey work and will post them on the web site and in the next edition of the e-bulletin.

Finally and importantly, care is needed particularly when surveying Sand Martins. Obvious hazards are deep water bodies and steep unstable slopes. The laws relating to trespass and access obviously also apply.

#### **Nathistcam**

A new project, 'Nathistcam', looking at the flora and fauna of Cambridge City including of course the birds, has commenced. The project has two main objectives:

- To create a snapshot of the flora and fauna of Cambridge City and its immediate environs.
- To increase public awareness of the diversity of plants, animals, birds and fungi in the City. Recording will run to December 2019. Records from the decade 2010-2019 are the main focus, but earlier records will provide historical background. The area covered is bordered by the A14 in the north, the M11 in the west, Trumpington in the South and Cherry Hinton and Fen Ditton in the east. A map of the 64 x 1Km squares covered is available on the project website <a href="www.nathistcam.org.uk">www.nathistcam.org.uk</a> At our Christmas Bird Club meeting I introduced the project to the Club and suggested we become involved in a specific topic as well as record the bird life of the City during the project period. The specific topic I propose is a survey of <a href="www.mitering">wintering Blackcaps</a> I have put this on the CNHS website blog.

The objective is to record the number and distribution of wintering Blackcaps in the project area. Why Blackcaps?

- This study is inspired by Roger Isted's work. Roger found, using coloured rings, 12 different Blackcaps used his Harston garden in winter 2012/13 and 13 different Blackcaps used his garden in winter 2013/2014 all were different individuals from the winter 2012/2013.
- The British Trust for Ornithology in their Garden Birdwatch project says the availability of garden bird food and milder winters has helped Blackcaps evolve a new migration route and new behaviour. Blackcaps breeding in S. Germany and Austria now migrate NW to Britain instead of SW to Spain.
- Rebecca Buisson in her Cambridge garden bird survey has some City records available.
- Blackcaps readily come to garden feeders, and can be identified by birders and non-birders!
- This topic would tie-in with the NatHistCam Mistletoe survey Blackcaps have become our most efficient distributers of mistletoe seeds (apparently better than Mistle Thrushes!)

The information on wintering Blackcaps requested is: <u>Date seen</u>; <u>where seen</u> (Street name); <u>male or female</u>; optional - any other observations such as feeding habits – what are they eating (e.g. Apples, Ivy, Mistletoe, Honeysuckle berries etc.); display/aggression. It is also worth looking for any which are colour-ringed and report these to the BTO.

The project will last until to March 2019 covering winter periods: 16/17, 17/18, 18/19.

#### Cambridgeshire Bird Club Summer Garden Bird Survey 2016

May I send an immense 'thank you' to all that took part in this survey. From comments received many of you have enjoyed this survey and quite a few recorders have sent in more detail than requested about the birds feeding, nesting and using their gardens.

In total 30 gardens were surveyed last summer in the county. Of these 19 were rural and 11 were urban. The largest numbers of species recorded were, rural garden - 43 species, urban garden - 37 species.

Three species were seen in 2016 but not seen in the previous summer's survey: Little Egret, Lesser Redpoll and Lesser Spotted Woodpecker. Six species that were seen in 2015 and but not 2016 were: Cuckoo, Fieldfare, Pied Flycatcher, Sedge Warbler, Brambling and Racing Pigeon. There were no direct observations of the disease Trichomoniasis from any of the gardens surveyed last summer. Notes that observers have included are:

- -the Heron has eaten my two goldfish
- -returning home after being away to find a pair of Mallards nesting in the garden
- -a conversation with neighbours about Tawny Owls nesting in the neighbouring garden and seeing Treecreepers in the garden

As many of you may know by now, the decision has been made to take a break from the survey of garden birds for a while. The number of people taking part had declined and it was felt that it would be a good idea to take a break with a possibility to start again in October 2019. I am planning to write up the results with more details of the two years that were surveyed. All the results have been entered into the Bird Club's records and are available on request.

#### John Clark

It was with sadness that we learned of the death of John Clark (on Boxing Day at Peterborough Hospital). The amalgamation of 'old' Cambridgeshire and Huntingdonshire in 1972 presented a tricky dilemma for organisations such as the Bird Club. The avifaunal records had, for obvious reasons, always been separate and published separately. Gradually and with some reluctance the Club began to face reality and publish the records from both sources in its Annual Report although for several years they were kept separate. For most of those years John wrote the whole of the Huntingdonshire section in his capacity as Recorder for Hunts. At the time when I was Editor the joy of working with John was that his copy was presented on time and he helped massively by checking and correcting the printer's proofs, again returning them on time. After I relinquished the Editorship John nobly took it on, not just that, he expanded the production in all its forms including illustrations, tables and references to the past together with snippets of interesting behaviour of species. Today's Annual Reports follow the pattern he set. Unless you have done the job it is quite difficult to understand the volume of work required to put the Report together, a job that John did wonderfully well. He was made a Vice President of the Club to acknowledge his enormous contribution. Our Club has been, and still is, very fortunate that a few individuals are prepared to give their time so freely. Our thoughts are with his family at this sad time. PB

"I wrote Looking for the Goshawk because I was seeking answers to questions, prompted by an unexpected encounter. I thought I knew this bird, but this incident with the Goshawk challenged me. My mind raced with questions, and I became fixated by them and by the idea that the Goshawk could and should be anywhere, at any time, in the environment around me. Why was I not seeing it? What does its presence or absence tell us about us? I developed the sense that this is arguably the finest, best adapted, most versatile and rapacious bird we have; the apex, alpha predator of our landscapes... And we aren't even missing it. This was once the bird they measured a man or a forest's value by. Today, it has vanished from the cultural memory. I set out to try to change this. The book is, in the end, a book about us."

Conor Mark Jameson has worked in conservation for 25 years, and is the author of Silent Spring Revisited, Looking for the Goshawk, and Shrewdunnit: The Nature Files. He lives in north Cambs.
